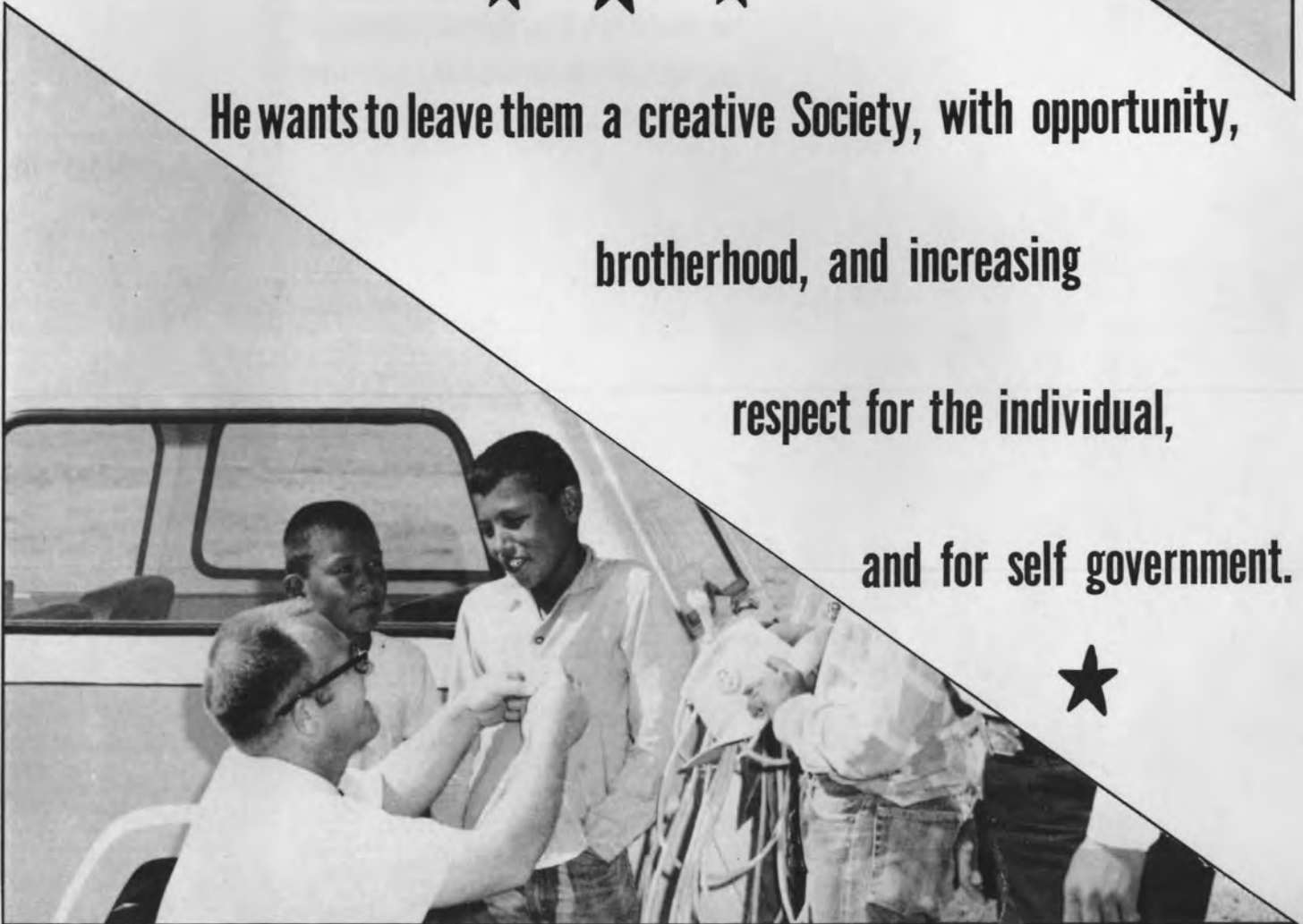

Comments About Congressman Ed Foreman

LOOK MAGAZINE (January 28, 1964), "The youngest member of the 88th Congress is conservative Republican Ed Foreman, who won himself a post on the powerful House Armed Services Committee. He wars on waste in Government for the 600,000 people of Texas' 16th Congressional District."

CONGRESSMAN MENDEL RIVERS, Demo.-South Carolina, an influential and experienced congressional leader, said on the House Floor (January 28, 1964), "Ed Foreman and I are on the opposite sides of the political aisle, but that does not preclude me from extending my warmest congratulations to him for an award which I know he fully deserves. Ed Foreman has brought to the Congress, and particularly the Committee on Armed Services, the spirit of youth, the charm of an active curiosity, and a remarkable ability to penetrate the sometimes cloudy economics of national defense. To him a million taxpayer dollars is still a great deal of money."

THE UNITED STATES JUNIOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE in honoring Ed Foreman as one of America's Ten Outstanding Young Men (January 25, 1964), stated, "Congressman Ed Foreman has proven to be an outstanding and articulate spokesman for responsible, conservative government. CONGRESSMAN BOB WILSON, Rep.-California, member of the House Armed Services Committee, in a speech at Odessa (January 11, 1964), "Ed Foreman has done more to tell the petroleum industry story and help preserve the percentage depletion allowance than any other Congressman I know. He's got things done that the vast majority of new Congressmen could never do—these things have saved you money, and have been in the cause of conservatism and free enterprise."
