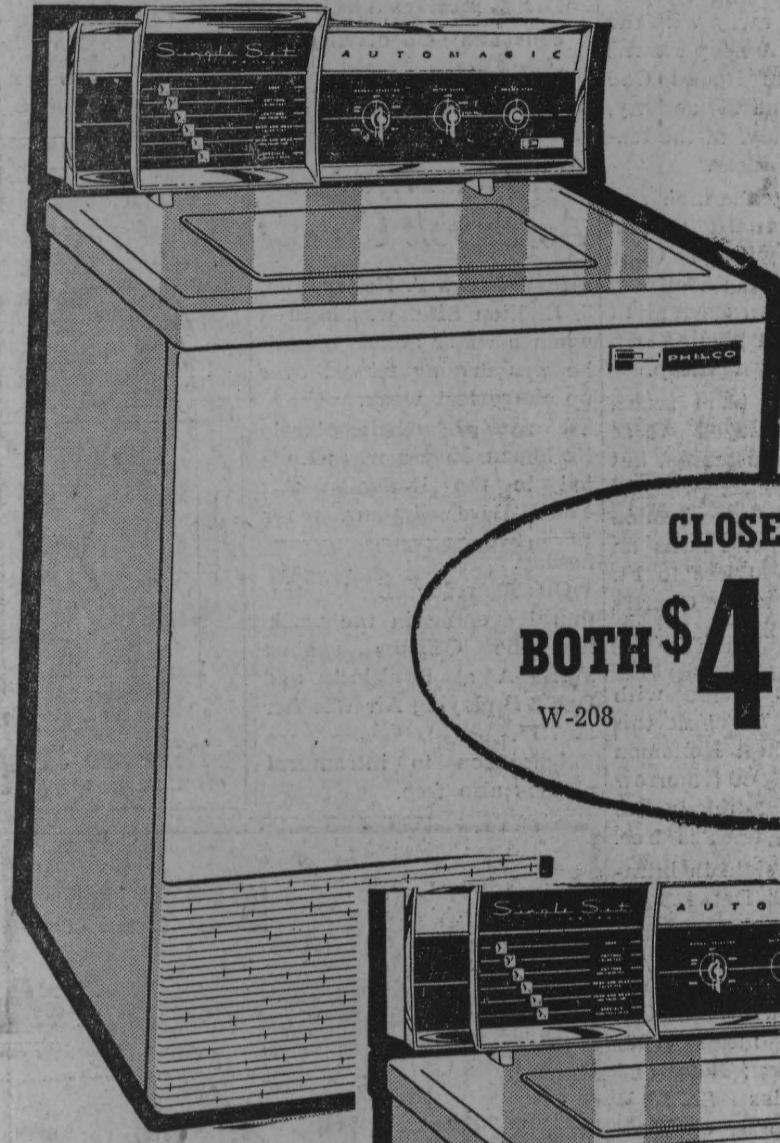

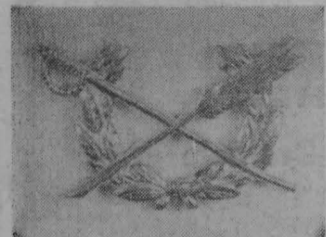

The Judge Advocate ADVISES

Many employers are in doubt as to whether Income Tax Withholding or Social Security Tax is applicable in the case of your "Domestic Household Help."

The fact is that Income Tax Withholding shall not be made in the case of "domestic household help," but, Social Security Taxes must be withheld and paid on the wages of a household employee if an employer pays an employee \$50.00 or more in cash wages in a calendar quarter for household service.

If this test is met, Social Security Taxes apply to all cash wages paid by the employer to the employee in each quarter, regardless of the quarter in which it is earned. The employer's tax and employee's tax are each three per cent of the first \$4800 of taxable wages paid, making a total of 6 per cent.

The Social Security Tax applies only to wages paid a household employee in cash. Likewise, checks, money orders, etc., are taxable in the same manner as cash. The value of meals, lodging, clothing, bus tickets, and other non-cash items furnished to household employees by his employer are to be disregarded as a basis for Social Security Tax. However, if cash is given in lieu of these enumerated items it constitutes "wages."

It is immaterial whether the wages involved are payable by the hour, day, week, month, year or piecework. The tax does not apply to amounts paid by the employ-

The employer should deduct the employee's Social Security Tax on each pay period if he expects the employee to meet the \$50.00 per quarter test.

If, for some reason, the employer does not deduct the employee tax from the taxable wages paid, he is nevertheless required to pay the employee tax himself to the District Director of Internal Revenue.

Beginning with the first calendar quarter in which an employee pays taxable wages to one or more household employees, the employer must file quarterly returns on Form 942 at the end of each calendar quarter, reporting taxable wages, if any, which are paid in each quarter. These forms may be obtained from the Office of the Staff Judge Advocate.

The Forms 942, when completed by the employer, should be mailed to the Office of the District Director of Internal Revenue in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

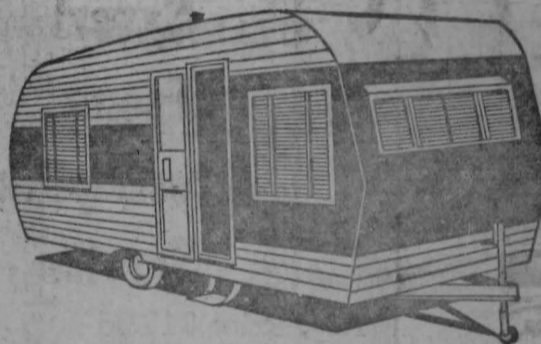
